What is intelligent learning?

The term 'intelligent learning environment' (ILE) refers to a category of educational software in which the learner is 'put' into a problem-solving situation. One or more agents that assist the learner in his task and monitor his learning.

What is the difference between learning and intelligence?

Intelligence is expressed in the ability to learn. Smart people learn faster and learn more than not so smart people. Intelligence is manifest in the ability to acquire complicated skills and excel in performance by practice and progressive improvement. Learning is the process of modifying brain structure and function.

Why is intelligence important in society?

"Intelligence is the most important commodity in today's society" An intellectually stimulating environment is essential to allow intelligence to develop. Some children lack such an environment, while others may be harmed by parents' frantic efforts to provide enrichment, says cognitive scientist Elsbeth Stern.

What is the best way to measure intelligence?

The intelligence quotient (IQ) is a measure of intelligence that is adjusted for age. The Wechsler Adult Intelligence Scale (WAIS) is the most widely used IQ test for adults. Brain volume, speed of neural transmission, and working memory capacity are related to IQ.

What is the relationship between understanding and learning?

Understanding is ability to make sense out of things. Learning is more based on how you are able to apply your understanding. You have to understand something to learn it, and you can't learn it without understanding it first. Just because you learnt it doesn't mean you understood it.

Can someone be intelligent but not well educated?

A person can be intelligent without having much education and a person can have a lot of education without being especially intelligent. Many professors are intelligent and well educated, but some professors I know are very well educated but not very intelligent.

What is Howard Gardner's theory of multiple intelligences?

The theory of multiple intelligences differentiates human intelligence into specific 'modalities', rather than seeing intelligence as dominated by a single general ability. Howard Gardner proposed this model in his 1983 book *Frames of Mind: The Theory of Multiple Intelligences*.

What are multiple intelligences in the classroom?

Here are the eight intelligences outlined in the MI theory. Linguistic intelligence = using words and language. Logical-Mathematical intelligence = using number/reasoning skills. Spatial intelligence = thinking three dimensionally. Bodily-Kinaesthetic intelligence = manipulating objects and being physically adept.
